



When I asked David Rung what his favorite hymn was, he had two answers for me. He likes #389, "Spirit of the Living God" by Daniel Iverson because he feels that it sets the tone for Communion services.

David also likes the Easter hymn #368, "He Lives" which is very upbeat. His favorite line from the hymn is "You ask me how I know He lives? He lives within my heart!" This hymn speaks to David and echoes his feelings about Jesus.

The composer, Alfred Henry Ackley, was born in Pennsylvania in 1887. He studied music in New York City and at the Royal Academy of Music in London. He attended Westminster Seminary in Maryland and served at a church in PA and later in California. He preached with great vigor on the reality of Christ's resurrection, which led him to write the song "He Lives" in 1933. He never dreamed it would become one of the church's most triumphant Easter hymns.

GETTING TO KNOW...

This is the fifth new member interview that was done by June Rung and Kathy Landis. The interview is with Jim Gray, a member of St. Paul's Technology Committee.

Q. Where are you from?

I grew up in Bucks County outside Langhorne until I attended Kutztown University where I lived in the dorms. I've always liked this area, but for now, I live in Mount Penn.

Q. What would you like to tell us about your family?

My father worked for the Bell Telephone Company for 35 years, and as a hobby, he restored old phones and other crafts. For a time, my mother also worked in another telephone office. Both my mother and father enjoyed collecting and selling antiques. They raised me in the Baptist church. It was very strict: no drinking, dancing, gambling, etc. My mother was very involved in Sunday School and DVBS. She now lives at The Heritage of Green Hills. She's in good health, remains very active and heads up a Bible study group there. I have one younger brother who lives in Southampton now but may retire soon to his other home in the New York Seneca Lake area.

I have three sons, two of which are twins. The twins are moving in together at Grays Ferry in South Philadelphia. My older son is married. He attended UTI (Universal Technical Institute in Chester County, PA) where he studied automotive technology. Now he is the head of the maintenance department overseeing all vehicles in a school district where he receives teacher benefits and pension. With my son Jesse, I go to different restaurants in Philadelphia on a monthly basis where we sample their cheesesteak sandwiches and review them on Facebook. As a result, people are sending me suggestions for other restaurants we should visit.

Q. Where did you get your education?

I attended Council Rock High School in Bucks County where I became involved with video production. After high school, I enrolled in Kutztown University and majored in telecommunications. While there, I worked as an R. A. (resident assistant) in the dormitory. On the bus to R. A. training at the University of Delaware, I sat with a young lady, also an R. A. whose name was Kim Kline. This was the start of a friendship that lasted over the years.

Q. What do you do for a living?

I own a video production company, VideoWorks Production Company. My biggest client is United Way of Berks County and we've had a great relationship for over 30 years. I also produce the Berks County Time Train, a series of videos on Berks County history presented on Channel 69. I love history. You may watch the 250+ videos on YouTube. I learned some lessons from the pandemic, as a result I recently made some changes to my business model. Instead of using one editor in-house, I've contracted out the work to numerous editors both locally and throughout the country. I found this practice is more flexible, quicker, and more financially savvy. I also do drone photography and videography, TV commercials, training videos and web videos.

Q. What are your hobbies?

I am a member of S.O.A.P.: The Spirit of the Airwaves Players. We re-produce old-time radio shows and perform at the WWII Show in Reading and at a variety of places. In nursing homes, we have performed for patients who are mostly uncommunicative, but when we sing the old-time ads, they sing along. We use the scripts from former radio shows like the Lone Ranger, Little Orphan Annie, Abbott and Costello, including the ads. Sound effects are part of the entertainment. (Ask Jim about these—they are fun!)

Q. What do you do on a Sunday morning in the church?

I often run the slideshow for worship checking to see if the slide matches what is being said and making adjustments, if necessary. At the same time, I run the video-stream for the live-stream service. Also, I operate our new remote camera. Someone else from the tech committee usually runs the manned camera to be sure they have shots of the pastor as she moves around. It is a calling from God to be participating in worship in this way and it expands participation for those who are unable to attend worship in the sanctuary.

Jim says his video-production business doesn't seem like work because he really enjoys it. Ask him anything about it and you will hear his enthusiasm. Thanks, Jim, for sharing.

Recipes from the kitchen of Sherry Leinbach

SOFT LEMONADE COOKIES

1 cup butter, softened

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

3 cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/3 cup thawed lemonade concentrate

TOPPINGS

1/2 cup thawed lemonade concentrate

Additional sugar



DIRECTIONS

In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Combine flour and baking soda; add to the creamed mixture alternately with 1/3 cup of the lemonade concentrate, beating well after each addition

Drop by rounded teaspoons onto ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 400 degrees F for 8 minutes. Remove to wire racks. Brush with 1/2 cup lemonade concentrate; sprinkle with sugar. Cool.

Yield: 6 dozen

CHERRY VANILLA CHOCOLATE CHIP CAKE

1 15.25 oz box vanilla cake mix

1 egg

1/2 cup unsweetened apple sauce

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 21 oz can cherry fruit filling

1 cup mini chocolate chips



DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Mix dry cake mix, egg, apple sauce and baking powder until well blended. Then, gently fold in the cherry fruit filling and chocolate chips. Pour evenly into a greased Bundt pan or 9x13-inch cake pan. Bake 35 - 45 minutes in a Bundt pan; 30 - 35 minutes in a cake pan or until golden brown and a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Serves: 12

Optional Icing: Combine 2 Tablespoons warm water, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, 1 teaspoon almond extract and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Add 1-2/3 cups powdered sugar and mix well with electric mixer until desired consistency is achieved. Drizzle over cooled cake.






