.My Favorite Hymn By Judy Heffley

When I asked Marjorie Weida what her favorite hymn was and why she liked it, she gave it a great deal of thought. It is "God Will Take Care of You" found on page 692 in our hymnal. These are her thoughts about this hymn:

"There have been many times in my life I have found myself looking back at the words of this hymn and feeling comforted. This hymn reminds me that God is always with me through good and bad situations. I have found myself reminding my friends at times when they were stressed and in need of comfort that God would take care of them, too. I have always gotten a certain amount of strength from this hymn. I sometimes find myself sitting and humming or singing the tune, and it helps me to overcome any difficult times I may be going through. I believe that God will always take care of me no matter what may happen. As the refrain says,

God will take care of you, Thro' every day, o'er all the way. He will take care of you; God will take care of you."

The composer, Civilla Martin (1866-1948), was born in Nova Scotia and died in Atlanta, Georgia. She and her husband, W. Stillman Martin, often wrote gospel songs for revival meetings. He also wrote the text for "His Eye Is on the Sparrow."

"God Will Take Care of You," written in 1904, is known throughout the world. The words to the song came to Mrs. Martin one Sunday when she suddenly became ill. Her husband, a minister, had a speaking engagement that day and didn't want to leave her. But their young son said, "Father, don't you think that if God wants you to preach today, He will take care of Mother while you are away?" When he returned later that day, his wife felt much better and had written the song. Her husband set the text to music.

This hymn inspires us to trust in God's care and wisdom.




