Here is the GOOD NEWS! WE DID BEGIN! The Transition Team has completed the St. Paul's Short Church Profile. The team did a terrific job by using the former long church profile as a base and updating it to reflect our current status and needs. By now, the Short Profile has been approved by the Consistory and forwarded to Pastor Kevin McLemore, the Search and Call Minister of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference. He will oversee the approval by the conference. When approved, the profile will be posted in order to make it available to potential Interim Pastors. When an Interim candidate is referred to St. Paul's, a few members of the Transition Team and officers of the Consistory will have the opportunity to interview. The candidate will have already been vetted for background check, qualifications, etc.

Once the Interim Pastor is hired and becomes acquainted with the church and its members, the Transition Team will then work with the pastor to develop the Long Profile. This more extensive profile is necessary to recruit for a settled full-time pastor. When the profile is complete, it will be presented to the congregation. At this time members will have the opportunity to review it and ask questions and offer positive suggestions. Taking these suggestions under consideration, the Consistory will review the profile again and make a decision to approve with any possible revisions.

Before the Long Profile is begun, the congregation will be asked to complete a <u>survey</u> (as mentioned in the last Pulse edition.) The survey will ask what we want more of in the church, what we want less of, and what we want to stay the same. Everyone should take the survey seriously and complete with love and open thoughts leading to what you think will improve our church.

Completing the Long Profile will take place in the next year. After it's approved, it will be forwarded to PSEC to start the search for a settled full-time pastor. Much work ahead, but as long as we keep working toward our goal together as one—praying, loving, forgiving, recognizing differences, but openly communicating and coming to agreement on how we can move forward—we will reap the rewards from God's grace.

Thanks to the Transition Team, the Consistory and everyone else who is helping to keep the church serving God, our congregation and the community! *Help us to want to and continue on your holy path, dear God.*

#### My Favorite Hymn by Judy Heffley

When I asked Ray Oswald what his favorite hymn was, without hesitation he said, "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" found on page 11 of our hymnal. This hymn was composed by Robert Robinson in 1758.

Robinson experienced a difficult childhood, grew up in poverty, and became a gang member. Ray is fascinated by Robinson, who yearned to be close to God, but had a tendency to wander away at the same time, a very human quality. Man cannot bring that closeness himself. He needs God "like a fetter." Robinson is a very honest portrayal of a man who wants to be close to God. He invokes God's strength to help him because his own strength wasn't enough to "fetter" him to God.

Robinson turned his life around and became a minister at age 23. The lyrics he wrote for this hymn are based on 1 Samuel 7:12, in which Samuel raises a monument saying, "The Lord has certainly helped us." He calls the stone Ebenezer, meaning the stone of help.

What does "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" mean spiritually? Fix your gaze upon God's love, learn from the melodious songs, sung by heavenly beings, and join in praises, the mount of his redeeming love. Ray likes the musicality of this hymn and feels the lyrics are a good reflection of the human struggle to get close to God. Robinson's words continue to inspire and encourage each new generation.


