

From the Pastor's Desk

How do we say, "God Loves You?"

I like to think of February as the month of love — not that all other months aren't full of love - but that we give our hearts and minds permission to *really* dwell on love this month. The ancient Greeks had several words for love while our English language lumps together all kinds of love and doesn't really tell us if it's directional. (As in I just "Love" that shirt you're wearing — I'm pretty sure the shirt is not loving anyone back!)

Coming from Pennsylvania, most of us are familiar with the *Philios* kind of love – that's what we usually call brotherly love, as in Philadelphia, the city of brotherly love. When we intentionally include everyone in this kind of love, it is the love we have for all the fellow humans with whom we share the planet.

The florists and confectioners are very interested in promoting the *Eros* kind of love this month as they encourage us to purchase flowers and candy for the one we are sweet on. If you have a soft spot for love stories, this is the month for you – and Hallmark channel is happy to share plenty of those stories.

St. Paul's Pocket Flag Project: Honoring Our Deployed Military

Sunday, February 23 from 9:00-10:00 a.m.

We invite you to join the Sunday School classes on Sunday, February 23 from 9:00-10:00 a.m. at St. Paul's UCC Kutztown in Fellowship Hall to fold little American flags to be given to deploying military personnel from Fort Drum's 10th Mountain Division. All members of the congregation, all Sunday School classes (youth and adult), and all parents and families, and extended family members are invited. Please come and help us. The flags will then be blessed during the worship service.

The Pocket Flag Project was conceived in October 2001, after visiting with fellow Boy Scout leaders who are veterans who served in Vietnam and the Gulf War. Both of them carried small, folded flags in their left shirt pockets. These men related how important those flags were and still are to them. The Pocket Flag Project has since grown into an international project and flags through the Pocket Flag Project have been distributed to over 2 million deploying military personnel. St. Paul's has folded thousands of pocket flags over the past 12 years!

Now, it is preferable for us to give monetary donations to "Friend" so that they can purchase just what is needed in the community, and often at much deeper discounts than we could get.

The community needs our offerings. We will have a special

"Souper Bowl of Caring" offering on Sunday, February 9th.

All proceeds from our Souper Bowl of Caring offering will go to Friend, Inc. We are using resources provided by the "Souper Bowl of Caring" organization (also known as tacklehunger.org) free of charge.

In 1990, Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group:

"Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat."

Since then, close to \$200 million has been generated for <u>local</u> charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring. It has become a powerful movement that transforms the time around the Big Game into the nation's largest celebration of giving and caring for those in need.

Please remember, I will never ask you to send money or gift cards or request that you send me money via PayPal, CashApp, Venmo or any other instrument.


Never send gift cards, cash, electronic funds to me or on my behalf.
