



YOUNG AT HEART

On February 19, Young at Heart celebrated a "once-great icon of America industry," Bethlehem Steel. Father and son, John and Steve Landis, were the presenters of the program, also the authors of the book, <u>Bethlehem Steel</u> Rusting Relic.

John Landis, a professor emeritus from Kutztown University in Communication Design, has been a tour guide for Historic Bethlehem Museums and Sites since 2019. Steve Landis, a graduate from KU, currently is now a head of sales for Continental Automotive with a hobby in photography. He had sanctioned access to take rare and elevated photos of Bethlehem Steel's derelict plant remains in 2006 after the plant had closed.

The slide presentation was factual and lively about the "Steel," the complicated process of making steel, and the positive influence the company had on the U. S. and international industry. It remarkedly helped to win both world wars. Near the end of the program, the speakers enlightened the audience with stories of prominent "Steel" structures which remain as living monuments of the former industrial giant, such as the Golden Gate Bridge. It was a popular program with 23 people attending from the community and 18 from the congregation. The book will be available in the Firefly bookstore.

What is this "Holy Humor?"

For centuries in Eastern Orthodox, Catholic and Protestant countries, the week following Easter Sunday, including "Bright Sunday" (the Sunday after Easter) was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

The custom was rooted in the musings of early church theologians that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. "Risus paschalis – the Easter laugh," the early theologians called it.

In 1988 the Fellowship of Merry Christians began encouraging churches and prayer groups to resurrect Bright Sunday celebrations and call it "Holy Humor Sunday," with the theme: "Jesus is the LIFE of the party."

We will celebrate our Holy Humor Sunday on April 27th at our 10:15am worship service. A shorter than normal sermon (surprise!!) and invitation to wear a silly (or not so silly) hat during worship. The joke is on the devil; Jesus has arisen from the dead!
