


Five hundred fifty-two (552) backpacks are all packed and ready to be delivered next week to the following schools:

Greetings from Consistory

My purpose in writing this column is to keep everyone up to date on some important happenings at St. Paul's. If you want to know about something I have not remembered to tell you, please read the minutes from the Consistory meetings posted on the bulletin board next to the office. Also, if you have any suggestions or questions, feel free to speak with Steve Leinbach, Daryn Keim, or myself.

As in the past, <u>our church activities going forward will require a team effort</u> on the part of all members. On June 15, the Consistory voted 7 to 2 in favor of hiring a three-quarter time Interim Minister. In addition, the poll taken in the congregation indicated that the majority favored a three-quarter Interim Minister. Following that, the Transition Interview Team interviewed a candidate for the position and decided unanimously to make an offer. Currently, the Consistory and Interim Interview Team are working closely with PA Southeast Conference guidelines to complete a scope of work for a three-quarter time Interim Minister based upon the wants and needs of the congregation reflected in the Church Short Profile. Since there will only be an average of 30-35 hours per week for three-quarter time as opposed to full-time at about 40-50 hours, the number of responsibilities must be altered to be appropriate, taking into account priorities. It is important for the congregation to understand what those pastoral responsibilities are, so they will be shared once they are determined.

After the scope of work is developed, the next step will be to discuss with the potential Interim the work duties, salary, and benefits. If the candidate approves, the Transition Team then will recommend the candidate to the Consistory for their approval. Following that, the draft Call Agreement will be written and forwarded to the conference for review. After it is approved, a Consistory officer and one Transition team member will meet with the Interim candidate to review the agreement to determine if both parties find it satisfactory. If so, the final Call Agreement will then be completed and signed with a start date established.

The current candidate is in Canada from July 23 to August 15 so that may delay the process. However, the Consistory will keep the congregation informed as to the progress.

On another positive note, a group of about twenty elders met with Pastor Deb to discuss church membership. The purpose was to determine how many active members we have. Two groups of elders reviewed the list of members and determined how many may or may not be active. Letters were sent out to those in question asking if they wanted to continue to be active or to be considered a "Friend of St. Paul's." We do not have all the results in yet. However, the elders agreed on the definition of an active member and that was approved by Consistory and added to St. Paul's bylaws.

Many blessings to all who have volunteered their time and talents for the critical decisions that are necessary for the future growth of our church. And thanks to all those in the congregation who help in many ways to show their support.
